FIRST AND SECOND RESPONDENTS' ANSWERING AFFIDAVIT

I, the undersigned,

LUCKY JOSEPH MABULE

do hereby make oath and state that:

1. I am an adult male person employed by the first and or Second Respondents as Brigadier, care of the State Attorney at SALU Building, Corner Francis Baard and Thabo Sehume Streets, Pretoria.
2. I am the directly responsible for the administration of the Central Firearms Registry and Registration of Firearms as contemplated in the Firearms Control Act, 60 of 2000 (hereinafter "the Firearms Control Act").
3. The contents of this affidavit fall within my personal knowledge and are both true and correct to the best of my knowledge. To the extent that some of the information does not fall within my personal knowledge, a confirmatory affidavit of the said

person shall be attached hereto and further confirm that I believe the truth and correctness of their averments.

4. To the extent that this affidavit contains submissions of a legal nature, the same has been made on the advice of my legal representatives.
5. I am duly authorized to oppose the relief sought by the Respondents to depose to this affidavit, to represent the Respondents herein.
6. To the extent that I fail to deal with any of the allegations in the Applicant's founding affidavit, such failure is not to be construed as an admission of the Applicant's allegations. Such allegations are denied.
7. I depose to this affidavit in opposition to the relief sought by the Applicant.

8. **THE RELIEF SOUGHT BY THE APPLICANT**

- 8.1. Ordering the respondents to comply with the section 39 (6) as the latest regulations 38, 39 and 40 of the Firearms Control Act, 60 of 2000 within a period of three months from the date of an order granted to this effect by the above Honourable Court and to generally to institute electronic connectivity as contemplated by the provisions of The Firearms Control Act 60 of 2000.



- 8.2.** For order ordering the Second Respondent to process SAP350 (Dealer stock returns), as contemplated by Regulation 39 of the Firearms Control Regulation, 2004 within 7 (seven) days of submission of such returns by a firearm dealer and to update the licensing database (known as the EFRS) with such information within 7 (seven) days of receipt hereof.
- 8.3.** For an order ordering the Second Respondents to disclose their licensing policies, consideration criteria and internal procedures utilized for the receipt of, and assessment of all firearm license applications including the individual firearm applications, import and export permits, in transit permits and any other permit contemplated by the Firearms Control Act as issued by the Second Respondent.
- 8.4.** For an order compelling the Second Respondent to process and record all information submitted on an SAP350 (a) and (b) form submitted by a firearm dealer if such information testing contained in a firearm dealer's register that has been inspected and approved by the South African Police Services prior to the date of the issue of this notice of motion and to load such information only EFRS as contained in the SAP350 (a) or (b) form even if such information is not on the EFRS.
- 8.5.** For an interdict interdicting and restraining servants of the First and Second Respondents from arresting any licenced firearm dealer, who has submitted

information to the South African Police Services in terms of an SAP350 (a) or (b) prior to this Notice of Motion if such information conflicts with, or is not contained in the Central Firearms Registry's database, pending implementation of the relief set out in prayer 5 above;

- 8.6.** For an order interdicting and restraining the Second Respondent from refusing licences in terms of Section 15, 16, 16A and/or 17 of the Firearms Control Act on the basis of:

"Insufficient motivation to convince the Registrar of the need for the rifle' Applicant failed to substantiate why rifles already registered on Applicant's name cannot address the need; alternatively, Applicant failed to convince the Registrar on reasonable grounds why firearms already registered in his name cannot address the need. "or any part of his paragraph.

- 8.7.** For an order interdicting servants of the First and Second Respondents from refusing licences on the basis of any similar reason requiring an Applicant for a section 15, 16, 16A and/or 17 firearm to prove "need" or refusing an application based upon an Applicant being in possession of a licenced firearm of a similar calibre.

- 8.8.** For an interdict interdicting servants of the First and Second Respondents from utilising the pre-printed reasons for refusal attached as Annexure "001-20" as grounds to refusing an application.

- 8.9.** For an order ordering servants of the First and Second Respondents to consider licence application on its own merits and to provide reasons that comply with the Promotion of Administrative Justice Act linked to the actual application for a firearm licence.
- 8.10.** For an order ordering the First Respondent to establish a Commission of Enquiry in the South African Police Services Central Firearms Registry for:
- 8.10.1.** the policies and procedures of, and the skills and competence of the Central Firearms Registry, as contemplated in terms of Section 84(2)(f) of the Act 108 of 1996.
- 8.10.2.** Ordering that such commission of enquiry be chaired by a Judge of the High Court.
- 8.11.** Further and/or alternative relief in respect of any of the above prayers.
- 8.12.** Costs of suit on attorney and client scale.

Before I deal with the merits of the application before this Honourable Court, there is a point in limine.

9. POINT IN LIMINE – DISPUTE OF FACT

- 9.1.** It is trite that in any application proceedings, the Applicant has to consider whether or not there will be any dispute of fact.
- 9.2.** Application proceedings are not recommended where a litigant foresees that his opponent will raise material disputes of fact in an answering affidavit in response to his founding affidavit.
- 9.3.** If a material dispute of fact arises when comparing the founding and answering affidavits, the court adjudicating the matter must dismiss the application if the Applicant foresaw or ought reasonably to have foreseen, before initiating the proceedings, that a dispute of fact would arise.
- 9.4.** Alternatively, the court will have to refer the material dispute of fact to oral testimony if it can be disposed of easily and speedily without affecting any other issues in the case.
- 9.5.** Alternatively, refer the entire matter for trial.
- 9.6.** The Applicant in the circumstances reasonably foresaw that there would be a material dispute of fact.

- 9.7. This is evidenced by the length of the founding affidavit that is filled with examples of the same thing and this Honourable Court will be directed to the relevant paragraphs in the Applicant's founding affidavit during the hearing of this matter.

10. BACKGROUND FACTS

10.1. APPLICATIONS PROCESS

10.1.1. The Registrar of Firearms is the National Commissioner of the South African Police Service. In order to give effect to the implementation of the Firearms Control Act, 2000, three levels of processing the firearm licence applications have been established, namely station, provincial and Head Office [Central Firearms Register].

10.1.2. All these levels are staffed with officials normally referred to as Designated Firearms Officers who have been specifically trained and appointed for the purpose of administrating the Act.

10.1.3. The administration of the Act entails *inter alia*, the following:

- 10.1.3.1. Receiving competency certificate and firearm licence applications; authorisations and permits applications;**
 - 10.1.3.2. Ensuring that all requirements in terms of the Act and Regulations are complied with;**
 - 10.1.3.3. Conducting of physical inspection where provided for by the Act;**
 - 10.1.3.4. Recommendation of the application by the relevant official;**
 - 10.1.3.5. Despatching of the applications to the Provincial office for verification and further despatching of same to the CFR for consideration.**
- 10.1.4 Renewal of firearm licence applications in terms of section 24 are considered at the provincial level.**
- 10.1.5 There is however an exception to the rule when it comes to section 21 and 74 authorisations and permits applications respectively. These may be couriered directly to CFR seeing that they should be**

finalised within 7, 21 and 30 days of lodging, whichever is applicable. These are also considered at CFR.

10.2 CONSIDERATION OF APPLICATIONS

A consideration Committee has been established and it comprises of the following:

10.1.1 Chairperson who may be a Colonel or Lieutenant Colonel depending on the delegated authority;


10.1.2 Two officials and;

10.1.3 Secretary.

The committee is guided by the following when considering applications:

- The Firearms Control Act, 2000;
- The Firearms Control Regulations, 2004;
- Promotion of Administrative Justice Act (hereinafter "PAJA");
- Delegation of Powers;
- Legal precedent;
- Checklists, and;
- Unique circumstances of each case.

10.2 ELECTRONIC CONNECTIVITY

- 10.2.1 Section 39(6) of the Act, require of dealers to establish and maintain a workstation which should link with a central database as prescribed in the Regulation 79.
- 10.2.2 Section 39(7) states that the Registrar may on good cause shown on application by the dealer, exempt the duties referred to in subsection 6. To this end, no application for exemption has been received by the Registrar for consideration.
- 10.2.3 The rationale for establishing a workstation that links with the central firearm database is simply that the processing of dealer's stock return (SAPS 350) would be expedited and accurate record keeping of firearms in dealer's possession is captured.
- 10.2.4 Secondly to enhance the transaction of firearm sales from one entity to the next in order to identify the correct current ownership of the firearm at issue.
- 10.2.5 The Existing Enhanced Firearms Register System (EFRS) was developed in the 2004 and was meant to be a low maintenance system to support the Firearms Control Act, 60 of 2000 in the interim pending the development of a new Firearms Control System to fully support the new Act.

- 10.2.6 The First and/or Second Respondents published a Request for Tender to provide for a Firearms Control System (FCS) to fully comply with the Firearms Act, 60 of 2000 for which the tender for the development of the new FCS was awarded.
- 10.2.7 The contract terminated, which matter is before this Honourable Court.
- 10.2.8 The National Commissioner approved the proposal to incorporate the building blocks of both the existing EFRS and the FCS designs for a Cohesive Firearms Solution pending the CSIR audit.
- 10.2.9 Firearms eSubmission solution is an electronic solution which is designed to enable the commercial agents, namely, the dealers, manufacturers and gunsmiths to submit their returns electronically by means of intelligent eforms within a process that ensures authentication and non-repudiation of submissions, to replace the entire manual paper-based returns submissions which are manually captured into the EFRS.
- 10.2.10 The Firearms Summit held between the Portfolio Committee on Police and the Civilian Secretariat for the Police during 2015 urged the requirement of the Firearms eSubmission solution to be operationalised and implemented.

- 10.2.11 The Independent Assessment of the FCS Development Project by the CSIR is anticipated to commence in parallel with the approved extensions of EFRS.
- 10.2.12 I am advised by Ms Pienaar, that on the 12th of January 2018, the Firearms eSubmission solution was presented and piloted to the number of dealers and manufactures. See Annexures "LJM1" and "LJM2" which are the presentation and Ms Pienaar's confirmatory affidavit respectively.
- 10.2.13 I am further advised by Ms Pienaar that the participants were excited by the proposal, a list of the participants is attached hereto marked Annexure "LJM3".
- 10.2.14 The Firearms eSubmission is divided into two phases, namely Phase 1 and Phase 2.
- 10.2.15 Phase 1 makes provision for use of intelligent electronic forms that require an Adobe Lifecycle licence and was ready to be implemented at the end of the 2017.
- 10.2.16 I am advised by Ms Pienaar that the First and Second Respondents had a contract with Adobe Systems Software Ireland Limited that has lapsed. Technology Management Services (TMS) has initiated a process by

engaging SITA to address the Adobe needs due to the non-approval of a new service provider by the National Treasury.

10.2.17 The Firearm eSubmission can thus only be implemented once the Adobe Lifecycle licence is in place. See annexure "LJM4"

10.2.18 The First and or Second Respondents have embarked on Phase 2 of the Firearm eSubmission, that entails a digital portal in which the SAP350, at the initial stages could be submitted.

10.2.19 Phase 2 is still at planning stage.

10.3 SUCCESS OF MANUAL SUBMISSION

In the absence of the electronic submission as contemplated in the Act, the CFR introduced a manual submission process in the form of an e-mail address, namely; Armscontrol1@saps.gov.za. This e-mail is monitored on daily basis and dealer's stock return are processed as and when received.

10.4 PROCESS FLOW FOR HANDING OVER OF FIREARMS

10.4.1 Firearms are continually handed over to the police for a variety of reasons.

A person may at any given time approach the police and voluntarily hand over to the police for the purposes of destruction.

10.4.2 The other circumstance under which firearms may be handed over to the police is when the Minister of Police has declared Amnesty in terms of section 139 of the Act. The process for handing over such firearms is as follows:

10.4.2.1 A person who wishes to surrender a firearm approaches the police at a police station and indicate the intention to hand over the firearm and also state the reason therefor.

10.4.2.2 A police official on duty will then assist the person concerned by providing the relevant forms that will be completed by the person him/ herself.

10.4.2.3 A police official will then record the details of the firearm so handed over in the SAPS Registers;

10.4.2.4 An acknowledgement of receipt will then be issued to the person who handed over the firearm as proof that the firearm was handed over and received by the police.

- 10.4.2.5** The firearm will then be subjected to an investigation process involving, inter alia, the **Integrated Ballistic Investigation System (IBIS)** to determine if such was involved in the commission of a crime or not.
- 10.4.2.6** In the event crime was committed through the use of such a firearm, criminal prosecution will ensue.
- 10.4.2.7** Where no crime is suspected, then the firearm will be processed for destruction and will be transferred from the name of the person who surrendered it to a State Department called, **SD 1**.
- 10.4.2.8** The firearm will subsequently be destructed by way of smelting at an approved facility.

10.5 CONSULTATION WITH STAKEHOLDERS

- 10.5.1** There has been a number of stakeholder engagement initiatives from the SAPS side with the purpose of engaging the firearms dealers on matters of relevance to their interest. In 2015 a number of sessions were arranged with stakeholder representatives with the subsequent establishment of two committees that were given various tasks to address.

10.5.2 One of the task team included the Applicant's Attorney of Record who also offered to assist in providing the CFR with an International Catalogue for Calibre Codes that were not available in the current system. It must be stated that such a promise was never fulfilled.

10.5.3 Besides there has been bilateral engagements between CFR and organisations such as NAACSA, which is a collectors' association.

10.5.4 On the 24 November 2017, another meeting between the SAPS and the broader stakeholder was convened for the purpose of drafting the Terms of Reference that will regulate the interaction between CFR and stakeholders. The meeting resolved that the Secretariat for Police will henceforth take over the chairpersonship of the stakeholder engagement. Applicant's Attorney of Record was present in this meeting and he is aware of the status of the stakeholder engagement between CFR and stakeholders.

12 AD PARAGRAPHS 11 to 15

I admit the allegations contained in these paragraphs.

AD BACKGROUND**13 AD PARAGRAPHS 16, 17, 18 and 19**

I note the purpose of this application as well as the averments made in these paragraphs but deny that the affairs of the CFR are in a chaotic state.

14 AD PARAGRAPH 20

I deny the allegations contained in this paragraph and put the Applicant to the proof thereof.

15 AD PARAGRAPH 21

I admit the allegations contained in this paragraph.

16 AD PARAGRAPHS 22 and 23

16.1 I note the allegations contained in these paragraphs.

16.2 It is my submission that the backlog was not caused by non – preparedness of the Central Firearm Register (hereinafter the “CFR”), there are variety of

issues some of which have been canvassed in this answering affidavit, that are responsible for the backlog.

17 AD PARAGRAPH 24

17.1 The Respondent is aware of the judgment. Applicant makes bald statements without indicating where the adverse findings are located in the said judgment.

17.2 The result thereof is that Respondent is not aware of such adverse comments, Applicant is therefore put to the proof thereof.

18 AD PARAGRAPHS 25 and 26

18.1 The Respondent is aware of the judgment. Applicant makes bald statements without indicating where the adverse are located in the said judgment.

18.2 The result thereof is that Respondent is not aware of such adverse comments, Applicant is therefore put to the proof thereof.

19 AD PARAGRAPHS 27, 28, 29 and 30

I note the allegations contained in these paragraphs, I however deny that there are problems.

20 AD PARAGRAPH 31

I note the allegations contained in this paragraph.

21 AD PARAGRAPH 32

It is not true that the report was not made public. In fact the Applicant has mentioned the said report in paginated page 216 where the report was made public.

22 AD PARAGRAPH 33

22.1 We are not aware of *"another"* report, neither does the Applicant give particulars of that *"another"* report in order to enable to deal with it.

22.2 This then makes the Respondent not be able to deal with the contents of this paragraph.

23 AD PARAGRAPHS 34, 35,36, 37and 38

I note the allegations contained in these paragraphs.

24 AD PARAGRAPH 39

- 24.1** I note the allegations contained in this paragraph, however an explanation would be apposite in the circumstances.
- 24.2** Major General Bothma was indeed suspended, he underwent the necessary disciplinary process whereat he was exonerated.
- 24.3** The position which he occupied was subsequently advertised and he followed all the processes and procedures required and he was the successful candidate, who was then appointed to the position.

25 AD PARAGRAPH 40

I note the allegations contained in these paragraphs.

26 AD PARAGRAPH 41

- 26.1** It is not true that the enquiry was premised upon the corruption from firearm dealers and trainers, it was about the functioning of the CFR, it was talking to governance, the processing of firearm licences and the backlog.



26.2 However, be that as it may, the enquiry had nothing to do with the Respondents but related to the Dealers.

27 **AD PARAGRAPH 42**

I note the allegations contained in this paragraph.

28 **AD PARAGRAPH 43**

28.1 It is incorrect that the outcome of the enquiry was never made public, the Applicant has in annexure "I" of paginated page 216 of the Applicant's founding affidavit wherein the contents of the said report were made public.

28.2 The press release of 2 November 2010 contains the outcome of the said press release.

29 **AD PARAGRAPH 44**

I note the allegations contained in this paragraph, however would like to point out to this Honourable Court that the contents of this paragraph are an indication that the report was made public as it formed part of the said litigation.

30 AD PARAGRAPH 45

30.1 I deny the allegations contained in this paragraph and put the Applicant to the proof thereof.

30.2 On perusal of the report contained in paginated page 349 of the Applicant's founding affidavit, one would not find any reference to an outstanding report.

31 AD PARAGRAPH 46

I admit the existence of the report but deny that its contents are a closely guarded secret.

32 AD PARAGRAPH 47

32.1 I note the allegations contained in this paragraph.

32.2 The recommendations have been complied with as stipulated in the report of the Public Protector, for instance pamphlets explaining how the application of a firearm must be done have been posted on every police station notice boards these pamphlets were displayed for consumption by the members of the public. See Annexure "LJM5".

33 AD PARAGRAPH 48

I note the allegations contained in this paragraph, more so that Applicant does not state how the technology system is inefficient and ineffective.

34 AD PARAGRAPH 49

The issue of lack or inadequacy of electronic connectivity is clearly explained in paragraph 10 above, which deals with the background facts.

35 AD PARAGRAPHS 50 and 51

I note the allegations contained in these paragraphs.

36 AD PARAGRAPH 52

36.1 Save to state that this paragraph deals with what happened in the past and does not address the current developments. The CFR does not have control of what the press choses to report.

36.2 Since then a lot has been done and is still being done in improving the operations of CFR.

37 AD PARAGRAPHS 53, 54, 55, 56, 57 and 58

I note the allegations contained in these paragraphs.

38 AD PARAGRAPHS 60, 61, 62 and 63

Save to state that the First and Second Respondents' representatives stated their position in the Portfolio Committee, I note the allegations contained in these paragraphs.

39 AD PARAGRAPHS 64, 65, 66 and 67

39.1 I deny that the Press Report dated 24 September 2014 quotes that the Portfolio Committee on Police found that the CFR is in an appalling state.

39.2 The remainder of the allegations contained in these paragraphs are argumentative.

40 AD PARAGRAPH 68

40.1 The system of handing over a firearm is as outlined in paragraph 10 above in the background.

40.2 I fail to see prejudice, if any that will befall the person handing over the firearm as alleged.

41 **AD PARAGRAPH 69**

I deny the allegations contained in this paragraph and put the Applicant to the proof thereof.

42 **AD PARAGRAPH 70**

42.1 The Constitutional Court has pronounced on this issue of relicencing of firearms with expired licences and held that the said firearms are illegal and the manner in which the Respondents have been dealing with them is correct.

42.2 Licences that are expired are illegal, and the constitutional court has confirmed that the said licences are illegal.

42.3 The issue of relicencing firearms is clear to be understood.

42.4 The relicencing will take place at the time or during the operation of an amnesty, we refer the court to paragraph 10 above dealing with background.

42.5 The blocking of the licence on the system is an administrative process designed to safeguard irregular relicencing of illegal firearms.

43 **AD PARAGRAPHS 71 – 74**

I admit the allegations contained in these paragraphs.

44 **AD PARAGRAPH 75**

I admit that continuity has been affected by change of leadership, which is something that is beyond the control of the Respondents, however it is not correct to say that the CFR is in a chaotic state.

45 **AD PARAGRAPHS 76 and 77**

The said court orders as well as the matters in which the warrant of arrests have been granted are subject of appeal. See Annexure "LJM6".

46 **AD PARAGRAPH 78**

Subject of appeal

47 AD PARAGRAPH 79

I note the allegations contained in this paragraph, however, I do not see the relevance of this paragraph in these proceedings.

48 AD PARAGRAPH 80

I deny the allegations contained in this paragraph and put the Applicant to the proof thereof.

49 AD PARAGRAPH 81

I note the allegations contained in this paragraph.

50 AD PARAGRAPHS 82 and 83

50.1 I note the allegations contained in these paragraphs.

50.2 It behooves of the Applicant to cooperate with the full scale review that is put in place.

51 AD PARAGRAPHS 84 and 85


LSM

I note the allegations contained in these paragraphs.

52 AD PARAGRAPHS 86 and 87

I note the allegations contained in these paragraphs to the extent that they are the Applicant's opinion.

53 AD PARAGRAPH 88

I note the allegations contained in this paragraph and further note that the Applicant is a stakeholder in the Firearms industry.

54 AD PARAGRAPH 89

I deny the allegations contained in this paragraph and the matter is fully ventilated in paragraph 10 above in the background.

55 AD PARAGRAPHS 90 and 91

I note the allegations contained in these paragraphs.

56 AD PARAGRAPH 92

Handwritten signature and initials, possibly 'W8M'.

I admit the allegations contained in this paragraph.

57 AD PARAGRAPH 93

I note the allegations contained in this paragraph.

58 AD PARAGRAPHS 94 and 95

58.1 I note the allegations in this paragraph, however the Applicant does not disclose specifics such as the date of purchase or names of people who were affected as he alleges.

58.2 The Applicant does not furnish information that who went to relicence and the personnel of the Police is not specified. It is not clear as to how a relicencing can take place when the Applicant has "an already existing licence physically in their possession".

58.3 The principle of relicencing is not understood as it is not envisaged in the Act nor the Regulations.

58.4 It is not disputed that the firearms were imported as alleged as it is clearly to be ascertained on Annexure V.

59 AD PARAGRAPHS 96 and 97

I note the allegations contained in these paragraphs.

60 AD PARAGRAPH 98

60.1 I would like to state that in fact the firearm 9,3x74 FarArm rifle bearing serial number 5E6801 is registered in Mr Hood's name. See attached annexure "LJM7".

61 AD PARAGRAPH 99

It is also the desire of the Respondents that firearm control be effectively monitored. However, given the myriad of challenges in its administration an order of court calling upon the respondents to rectify in haste would be unrealistic.

62 AD PARAGRAPH 100

Respondents are *ad idem* with the wishes of the Applicant and will always endeavor to enhance the control of the Firearms in South Africa.

63 AD PARAGRAPH 101



LJM

63.1 I deny the allegations contained in this paragraph.

63.2 I reiterate the averments made in paragraph 62 above.

64 AD PARAGRAPH 102

The Respondents agree, but submit that the breakdown, if any, is not intentional.

ELECTRONIC CONNECTIVITY

65 AD PARAGRAPHS 103 and 104

The Respondents are willing to comply with the Act regarding connectivity, but due to certain circumstances, connectivity has not yet been realized. See in this regard the background *supra*.

66 AD PARAGRAPHS 105 and 107

I note the allegations contained in these paragraphs.

67 AD PARAGRAPH 108


LSM

67.1 Having conceded that the electronic connectivity is not in existence, the Respondents have put in place the manual processing of the Dealers' stock return (SAP350) at the inception Firearm Control Act of the since 2004.

67.2 The Respondent can safely say that the manual processing Dealers' stock return (SAP350) has yielded some positive results. But the process is not without its own challenges.

68 **AD PARAGRAPH 109**

I admit the allegations contained in this paragraph.

69 **AD PARAGRAPH 110 to 112**

I note the allegations contained in these paragraphs.

70 **AD PARAGRAPH 113**

70.1 I admit that the meeting took place on the 12 January 2018 in the presence of selected dealers for the proposal on electronic connectivity.


LSM

70.2 The purpose of the meeting was to test the digital portal that was to be put in place in the absence of electronic connectivity. See background above in paragraph 10 above.

71 **AD PARAGRAPH 114**

Save to admit that the Applicant's representative addressed a letter to the Portfolio Committee dated 16th of January 2018, I deny the remainder of the allegations and the Applicant is put to the proof thereof.


72 **AD PARAGRAPH 115**

I note the averments contained in this paragraph and deny that the Applicant's representative had a meeting with Major General Bothma on the 23rd of October 2017 and Applicant is put to the proof thereof.

73 **AD PARAGRAPH 116**

The Respondents were not privy to the discussions between the Applicant's representative and Major General Bothma, and can thus neither deny nor confirm the said discussions.

74 **AD PARAGRAPH 117**


[SM]

I deny that Major General Bothma can be blamed for the inaccurate database as the functioning of the CFR database is also dependent on the information that the dealers provide.

75 AD PARAGRAPHS 118, 119 and 120

I note the allegations contained in these paragraphs.

76 AD PARAGRAPH 121

I note the allegations contained in this paragraph, however, the Respondents are not aware of a chaotic state of affairs.

77 AD PARAGRAPH 122 to 125

I bear no knowledge of the allegations made in this paragraph as a result the Respondent can neither admit nor deny the allegations herein.

78 AD PARAGRAPH 126


LSM

I bear no knowledge of the allegations made in this paragraph as a result the Respondent can neither admit nor deny the allegations herein since the Applicant does not provide the evidence in support of the allegations made.

79 AD PARAGRAPH 127

The allegations contained in this paragraph lack particularity, the Respondent can thus can neither admit nor deny the allegations herein.

80 AD PARAGRAPHS 128 to 130

I note the allegations contained in these paragraphs.

81 AD PARAGRAPH 131

I note that this matter is subject of litigation and therefore it will be inappropriate for the Respondent to deal with in this application.

82 AD PARAGRAPHS 132 -134

82.1 I deny the allegations contained in these paragraphs and the Applicant is put to the proof thereof.



LSM

82.2 This allegation is addressed in paragraph 60 above. However I would like to state that in fact the firearm 9,3x74 FarArm rifle bearing serial number 5E6801 is registered in Mr Hood's name.

83 AD PARAGRAPH 135

I admit that electronic connectivity would assist in identifying the problems, however, each case has its own history.

84 AD PARAGRAPH 136

84.1 Save to deny that the requirements as set out by the Respondents in submitting the SAP521(g) are arbitrary and onerous, I admit the remainder of the averments made in these paragraphs.

84.2 I note the putting in place of SAP521(g) which is in the interest of the dealers and members of the public.

84.3 The fact that the Respondents' employees may make mistakes does not render the mechanism in place burdensome and incorrect. Applicant is trying to suggest that two wrongs make right.

Handwritten signature and initials, possibly 'H' and 'LHM', located in the bottom right corner of the page.

85 AD PARAGRAPH 137 to 149

I note the averments contained in these paragraphs.

86 AD PARAGRAPH 150

The Respondents can neither deny nor admit the averments made in this paragraph because of its vagueness.

87 AD PARAGRAPH 151

I note the allegations contained in this paragraph.

88 AD PARAGRAPHS 152 and 153

88.1 I note the allegations contained in this paragraph.

88.2 The inaccuracies in the CFR cannot be solely attributed to electronic connectivity, there are other factors which include corruption on the part of the dealers and some members of the Respondent, which aspect is subject of the Task Team appointed.

89 AD PARAGRAPH 154

Handwritten signature and initials, possibly 'LSM'.

Save to note the averments made herein, I submit that this was not an authorized process and this is one of the processes that led to the inaccuracies in the CFR records.

90 AD PARAGRAPHS 155 to 160

I note the averments contained in these paragraphs.

91 AD PARAGRAPH 161

91.1 I admit the allegations contained in this paragraph in so far as it articulates the position of the CFR record on the 2nd of February 2018.

91.2 The Respondents' records reflect that the said firearm is currently in deed on the Dealer's stock of Classic Arms and not on the Dealer's permanent import permit. See annexure "LJM8".

92 AD PARAGRAPHS 162 to 164

92.1 I note the averments contained in these paragraphs and still maintain that the process was not authorized hence it was stopped.

Handwritten signature and initials, likely 'LJM', located at the bottom right of the page.

92.2 The Applicant states that this unauthorized system took place from the year 2006 to 2017 when General Major Bothma stopped it, and the process did not involve the CFR hence the inaccuracies and discrepancies in the CFR records.

92.3 It must be noted that this unauthorized process persisted for about 11(eleven) years.

93 AD PARAGRAPH 165 and 166

93.1 The allegations contained in paragraph 165 of the Applicant's founding Affidavit is a sweeping statement without particularity.

93.2 It is unthinkable to accept that a firearm can be reflected on the system without the particulars of the owner thereof. I note the allegations contained in these paragraphs.

93.3 Suffice to state that the Respondents do capture SAP350 timeously.

94 AD PARAGRAPHS 167 to 169

I note the averments made in these paragraphs.

Handwritten signature and initials, possibly 'LSA'.

95 AD PARAGRAPH 170

95.1 I admit that the changes had to take place in order for the Respondents' system to recognize the new codes.


95.2 There was a meeting whereat the change of calibration was discussed, wherein the Mr Hood who is the Applicant's attorney of record, and often representing the Applicant in the stakeholder meetings, offered to assist the Respondents to get a catalogue in order to effect the said calibration. I attach hereto the relevant presentation addressing this issue as Annexure "LJM9".

96 AD PARAGRAPHS 171 and 172

I note the allegations contained in these paragraphs.

97 AD PARAGRAPH 173 and 174

I note the allegations contained in these paragraphs.

98 AD PARAGRAPH 175
LJM

98.1 I deny the allegations made in this paragraph and the Applicant is put to the proof thereof.

98.2 Further it should be noted that this is an internal administrative action.

99 AD PARAGRAPHS 176 and 177

I note the allegations contained in these paragraphs.

100 AD PARAGRAPHS 178 and 179

As much as I concede the information has to be processed by the Respondents within 7 days, the Respondents cannot bind themselves to the same time periods, but shall be processed within a reasonable time.

101 AD PARAGRAPH 180

I admit the allegations contained in this paragraph.

102 AD PARAGRAPHS 181 to 184


LJM

I note the allegations of the presence of a spreadsheet, the Respondents deny that the said spreadsheet details the inaccuracies and inefficiency on the part of the Respondents, and the Applicant is put to the proof thereof.

POLICIES AND PROCEDURE

103 AD PARAGRAPH 185

- 103.1 The Respondents do not have codified licencing guidelines, but in determining an application, Respondents depend entirely on the evidence before the Consideration Committee tasked with assessing the individual licence applications.
- 103.2 This by implication means that every case is attended to on its own merit.
- 103.3 It is unthinkable that the Applicant wants the Respondents to think in a fixed particular manner when considering an application.

A handwritten signature in black ink, consisting of a stylized, cursive initial 'H' followed by the letters 'SM'.

103.4 The Consideration Committee when deliberating on the application for a licence, take the provisions of the Regulations and provisions of the Act into consideration.

103.5 The Applicant does not aver or allege that the absence of such guidelines has resulted in applications being unfairly dismissed or not considered.

103.6 This Honourable Court is referred to paragraph 10 *supra*.

103.7 The Applicant is not without a remedy if the application has failed, the principle of *ibi ius remedium* applies.

104 AD PARAGRAPH 186

104.1 The Respondents bear no knowledge of what General Major Bothma communicated to the Applicant's attorney of record, the Respondents can neither admit nor deny same.

104.2 It is noteworthy to state that the requirements which the Applicants have to comply with when applying for a licence are contained in the Firearm Control Regulations.

A handwritten signature in black ink, appearing to be 'LJM', located in the bottom right corner of the page.

105 AD PARAGRAPH 187

105.1 I deny the allegation in this paragraph and Applicant is put to the proof thereof.

105.2 As pointed out above, the Respondent when considering the applications for licence complies with the provisions of section 33 of the Constitution.

105.3 This Honourable Court is referred to the provisions of Regulation 89 which reads as follows:

“Administrative justice

89. Any police official taking an administrative decision in terms of the Act which may detrimentally affect the rights of a person, must -

(a) immediately when the decision is made, record in writing the reasons for the decision;

(b) append his or her signature, together with the date, to the reasons; and

(c) without delay notify the person concerned in writing of the decision stating the reasons referred to in paragraph (a) and the date and place where the decision was taken.”

106.1 I note the allegations that are made in this paragraph.

106.2 The allegations contained in paragraph 189 of the Applicant's founding affidavit does not support the averments made in paragraph 188 of the Applicant's founding affidavit.

107 AD PARAGRAPH 190

107.1 It is the Respondents' view that the Respondents are complying with the turnaround strategy as outlined in Portfolio Committee.

107.2 However, the Respondents fail to comprehend the relevance of the averments in paragraph 189 of the Applicant's founding affidavit as amplifying the contents of paragraph 188 of the Applicant's founding affidavit.

108 AD PARAGRAPH 191

I note the contents of what was said.

Handwritten signature and initials, possibly 'LSM', located in the bottom right corner of the page.

109 AD PARAGRAPH 192

The opinion of the Applicant's attorney of record is noted.

110 AD PARAGRAPHS 193 – 195

110.1 The averments contained in these paragraphs are noted as far as they expresses the views of the Applicant's attorney record.

110.2 It must be noted that on perusal of minutes, there is no indication that Lft General Masemola would develop a criteria for decision making.

111 AD PARAGRAPHS 196 – 197

111.1 I deny the allegations contained in these paragraphs and Applicant is put to the proof thereof.

111.2 There are no commitments made by Lft General Masemola as it is alleged in paragraph 194 in the Applicant's founding affidavit.

111.3 The Respondents have always applied the policy, procedure and criteria as set out, *inter alia*, in Regulation 13, 14, 15 and 89.

**FURTHER PROCESSING OF SAP350'S ON INFORMATION CONTAINED IN
DEALER'S REGISTER**

112 AD PARAGRAPH 198

I note the allegations contained in this paragraph.

113 AD PARAGRAPH 199

I deny the allegations contained in this paragraph and the Applicant is put to the proof thereof.

114 AD PARAGRAPH 200

114.1 The four year period is an exaggeration of the state of affairs, however, CFR concedes that it had to deal with a massive backlog of applications.

114.2 The remainder of the allegation contained in this paragraph have already been responded to in the preceding paragraphs.

115 AD PARAGRAPH 201



LJM

Whilst noting the increase and the decrease of the firearm dealers, there is no direct evidence placed before this Honourable Court that link the reasons for the decline in the number of dealers being related to the alleged administrative incapacity.

116 AD PARAGRAPH 202

Whilst acknowledging what was said by Ms Reneta Fourie, the Respondents deny that Ms Reneta Fourie attributed that to the alleged administrative incapacity of the Respondent.

117 AD PARAGRAPH 203

I deny the allegations contained in this paragraph and the Applicant is put to the proof thereof.

118 AD PARAGRAPHS 204 to 206

118.1 The Respondents cannot be blamed for the averments contained in these paragraphs.

118.2 It is clear from the allegations contained in paragraph 206 of the Applicant's founding affidavit that the inaccuracy in the CFR records were a direct result of the Applicant and its trading partners.

A handwritten signature in black ink, appearing to be 'H. L. M.', located in the bottom right corner of the page.

118.3 The Respondents are the administrators of the Firearms Control Act, whether or not the provisions of the Firearms Control Act are onerous, should be put at the doorstep of the Legislature.

119 AD PARAGRAPH 207

119.1 The Applicant does not take this Honourable Court into its confidence by failing to mention the specific applications that were declined in order to allow the Respondents to properly respond to the averments made in these paragraphs.

119.2 The Applicants is taking the Respondents, with respect this Honourable Court into a realm of speculation.

119.3 The Applicant wants the Respondents to rectify the bungle created by its members as amplified in paragraph 206 of the Applicant's founding affidavit.

120 AD PARAGRAPH 208

The Respondents cannot be faltered for complying with the provisions of the law when requesting the Applicant or any dealer to produce the original permit.


LSM

121 AD PARAGRAPH 209

I deny the allegations contained in this paragraph and the Applicant is put to the proof thereof.

122 AD PARAGRAPHS 210 and 211

122.1 I have no knowledge of the allegations contained in these paragraphs, and acknowledge the benevolence of the dealer, however, they have no justification for ignoring the law.

122.2 It was thus illegal of the Applicant's members to take firearms without compliance with the law.

123 AD PARAGRAPHS 212 to 214

123.1 In 2005 and 2010, there was amnesty declared in which the category of firearms described by the Applicant could have been legitimized in accordance with the provisions of section 139(4)(a) of the Act.

123.2 In addition, the Applicant does not disclose why it could not employ the provisions of section 139(4)(a) to address the stock in its members hand or in the possession of the dealers.


LSM

123.3 I deny the remainder of the allegations contained in these paragraphs and the Applicant is put to the proof thereof.

124 AD PARAGRAPH 215

It is difficult to identify the highlighted portions in annexure C of the Applicant's founding affidavit save for the highlight in paginated page 80 (i) of the Applicant's founding affidavit which does not bear any relevance to paragraph 214 nor 215 of the Applicant's founding affidavit.

125 AD PARAGRAPH 216

125.1 I reiterate the averments made in paragraph 123 above.

125.2 It is my submission that such firearms can only be legalized in accordance with the provisions of section 139 of the Act.

126 AD PARAGRAPH 217

126.1 Again, the Applicant make a general statement about affidavits whose contents have not been disclosed to the Respondents in order for the Respondents to make an informed decision.

A handwritten signature in black ink, appearing to be 'LSM' with a stylized flourish above it.

126.2 It is my submission that even if the Applicant had filed in affidavits to assist its members, such firearms can only be legalized in accordance with the provisions of section 139 of the Act.

127 AD PARAGRAPH 218

I deny the allegations contained in this paragraph and the Applicant is put to the proof thereof.

128 AD PARAGRAPHS 219 to 221

I note the allegations contained of these paragraphs.

129 AD PARAGRAPH 222

129.1 I note the allegations contained in this paragraph, and further note that this is just the Applicant's an opinion.

129.2 Applicant is trying to justify the presence of illegal stock in its member's possession.

130 AD PARAGRAPHS 223 to 225

Handwritten signature and initials, possibly "LJM", in the bottom right corner of the page.

130.1 I note the allegations contained in these paragraphs, it is not true that the Applicant's members do not know what to do with these firearms.

130.2 The Applicant is creating an impression that nothing can be done with these firearms and puts the blame on the alleged ineffectiveness of the Respondents.

130.3 This cannot be true given the amnesty that was in place in 2005 and 2010 in terms of section 139 of the Act.

131 AD PARAGRAPH 226

There is no need for the Respondents to be compelled to place these firearms onto the database of the CFR, all that is needed is for the Applicant to request the Respondent to place the said firearms in the CFR database procedurally in accordance with the provisions of the Act and the Regulations.

132 AD PARAGRAPH 227

I note the allegations contained in this paragraph.

133 AD PARAGRAPH 228

Handwritten signature and initials, possibly 'L&M'.

I reiterate the averments made in paragraph 131 above.

134 AD PARAGRAPH 229

I admit the allegations contained in this paragraph.

135 AD PARAGRAPHS 230 to 231

I note the suggestions made by the Applicant, however, compliance with the provisions of the Regulations is of paramount importance.

136 AD PARAGRAPHS 232 and 233

I note the allegations contained in this paragraph.

REASONS FOR REFUSAL

137 AD PARAGRAPH 234

I deny the allegations contained in this paragraph and the Applicant is put to the proof thereof.

138 AD PARAGRAPH 235


LSM

These are Applicant's deductions and opinion in as far as what was said by the Chairman in the committee, as a result the Respondents find it difficult to respond to the Applicant's opinion.

139 AD PARAGRAPH 236

I note the allegations contained in this paragraph.

140 AD PARAGRAPH 237

The CFR relies on the provisions of the Act and Regulations regarding compliance, thereafter consideration of the applications is done based on the merit of the application.

141 AD PARAGRAPH 238

I deny the allegations contained in this paragraph and the Applicant is put to the proof thereof.

142 AD PARAGRAPHS 239 and 240


LJM

142.1 I have perused the annexures O1 - O20 and submit that the reasons are valid in terms of keeping control in terms of the purpose of the Firearm Control Act.

142.2 In addition thereto, the said reasons are supported by the Preamble of the Firearm Control Act.

143 AD PARAGRAPH 241

143.1 I deny the allegations contained in this paragraph. The Firearm Control Act provides for the information necessary for firearm licence application.

143.2 Chapter 3 of the Regulations specifically 13(1) and the Regulations are public documents.

144 AD PARAGRAPHS 242 and 243

I note the allegations contained in these paragraphs.

145 AD PARAGRAPH 244

145.1 It is my submission on behalf of the Respondents that reference to Major General Bothma's letter dated the 10th of September 2010 is the author's opinion.



LJM

145.2 It is the Respondents' submission that the letter is not evasive and vague as it is clear and understandable.

146 AD PARAGRAPH 245

I note the allegations contained in this paragraph.

147 AD PARAGRAPH 246

I reiterate the provisions of Chapter 3 of the Regulations, the Applicant's allegation that the Applicant's employees do not know what information should be submitted is a sweeping statement lacking particularity.

148 AD PARAGRAPH 247

148.1 It is interesting to note that the Applicant does not differentiate between an enabling Act and the Regulations thereto, reference to the form SAP271 is not found in the Act but in the Regulations.

148.2 Regulation 13(2) provides that:

"An applicant referred to in subregulation (1), must submit the duly completed relevant application form, prescribed in Annexure "A" and

the required information together with any required supporting documents.”

HOW THIS APPLICATION CAME ABOUT: FAILURE TO CONSULT

149 AD PARAGRAPH 266

I note the allegations contained in this paragraph.

150 AD PARAGRAPH 267

I admit the averments contained in this paragraph as far as relates to consulting and engaging the Respondents.

151 AD PARAGRAPH 268

I deny that the engagements between the Respondents and firearm industry stakeholders has spectacularly failed, in fact a review committee was established in order to deal with the underlying challenges experienced by the Respondents and the firearm industry stakeholders.

152 AD PARAGRAPHS 269 to 272



Handwritten signature and initials, possibly "LJM".

I admit the allegations contained in these paragraphs.

153 AD PARAGRAPHS 273 to 277

153.1 I dispute the fact that the stakeholder engagement process has died.

153.2 I admit that a stakeholder meeting took place on the 24th of November 2017.
The purpose of the meeting was to establish terms of reference for future engagements.

153.3 The proposed terms of reference were dispatched to the stakeholders for comment.

153.4 The parties have at the time of drafting this answering affidavit, not found common ground regarding the terms of reference resulting in the stalling of further engagement.

154 AD PARAGRAPH 278

The allegations contained in this paragraph are devoid of the truth.

155 AD PARAGRAPH 279

Handwritten signature and initials, possibly 'LSM', in the bottom right corner.

In annexure TT mentioned in this paragraph no mention is made of any stakeholder, either included or excluded.

156 AD PARAGRAPH 280 – 286

- 156.1** The two examples mentioned took place as an administrative function and was in the best interest of members of the public.
- 156.2** It need to be noted that indeed the licences are now being printed by Government Printers.
- 156.3** The involvement of Government Printers was as a result of the expiring of the agreement between Respondents and the service provider.
- 156.4** Due to the massive financial implications connected thereto, it was then decided that a cost saving measure would be found in transferring the printing of the licences to Government Printers.
- 156.5** The respondents in doing this did not anticipate delays and frustrations to ensue on the part of the consumers.

156.6 If the delay has caused the frustration as alleged, Respondents tender an apology.

157 AD PARAGRAPH 286

I note the allegations contained in this paragraph.

158 AD PARAGRAPHS 287 and 288

158.1 I note the allegations contained in these paragraphs and the Applicant's concerns have been addressed in Annexure "VV".

158.2 It is my submission that the said amnesty does apply to dealers.

159 AD PARAGRAPH 289

The Respondents are not in a position to proffer a reason why the Portfolio Committee has not responded to the Applicant's letter in annexure "VV".

WHY COMMISSION OF ENQUIRY IS NECESSARY

160 AD PARAGRAPHS 290 and 291


LON

The appointment of a commission of an enquiry is the prerogative of the President in terms of section 84(2)(f) of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa and not the Courts.

161 AD PARAGRAPH 292

I deny that the Applicant has made a proper case for granting of the orders as prayed for in the notice of motion.

WHEREFORE the Respondent prays that the Applicant's claim be dismissed with costs.

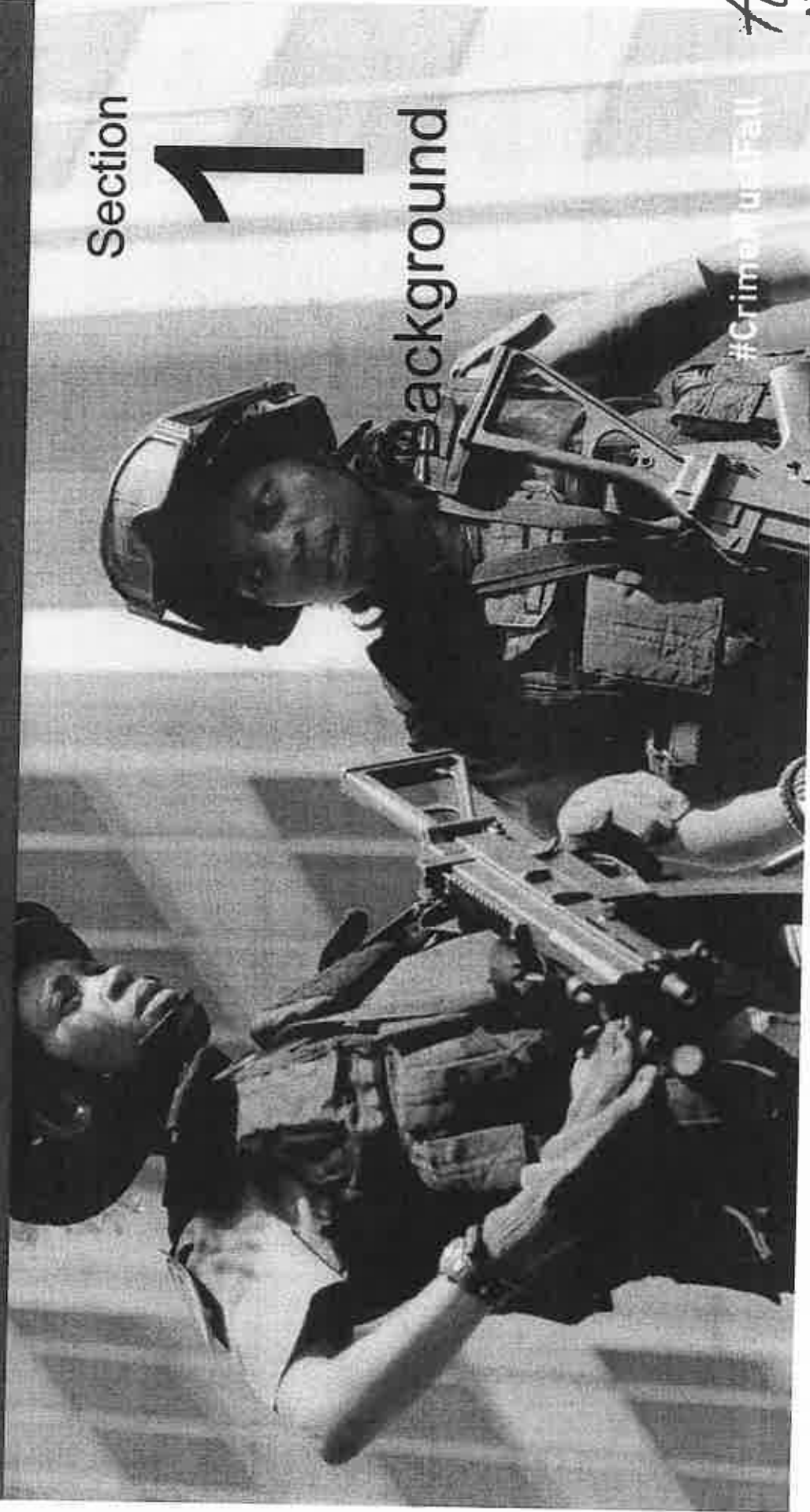

Origination of the EFRS and Cohesive Firearms Solution



- The Existing Enhanced Firearms Register System (EFRS) was developed in the 2004 and was meant to be a low maintenance system to support the Firearms Control Act, 60 of 2000 in the interim pending the development of a new Firearms Control System to fully support the new Act
- SAPS published a Request for Tender to provide for a Firearms Control System (FCS) to fully comply with the Firearms Act, 60 of 2000 for which the tender for the development of the new FCS was awarded and the contract eventually terminated
- The National Commissioner approved the proposal to incorporate the building blocks of both the existing EFRS and the FCS designs for a Cohesive Firearms Solution pending the CSIR audit
- The Firearms Summit held between the Portfolio Committee on Police and the Civilian Secretariat for the Police during 2015 urged the requirement of the Firearms eSubmission solution to be operationalised and implemented
- The Independent Assessment of the FCS Development Project by the CSIR is anticipated to commence in parallel with the approved extensions of EFRS

Functionalities of the Firearms eSubmission Solution



The Firearms eSubmission solution is to enable the Commercial Agents, i.e. the Dealers, Manufacturers and Gunsmiths to submit their returns electronically by means of intelligent eforms within a process that ensures authentication and non-repudiation of submissions, to replace the entire manual paper-based returns submissions which are manually captured into the EFRS

General Functionalities:

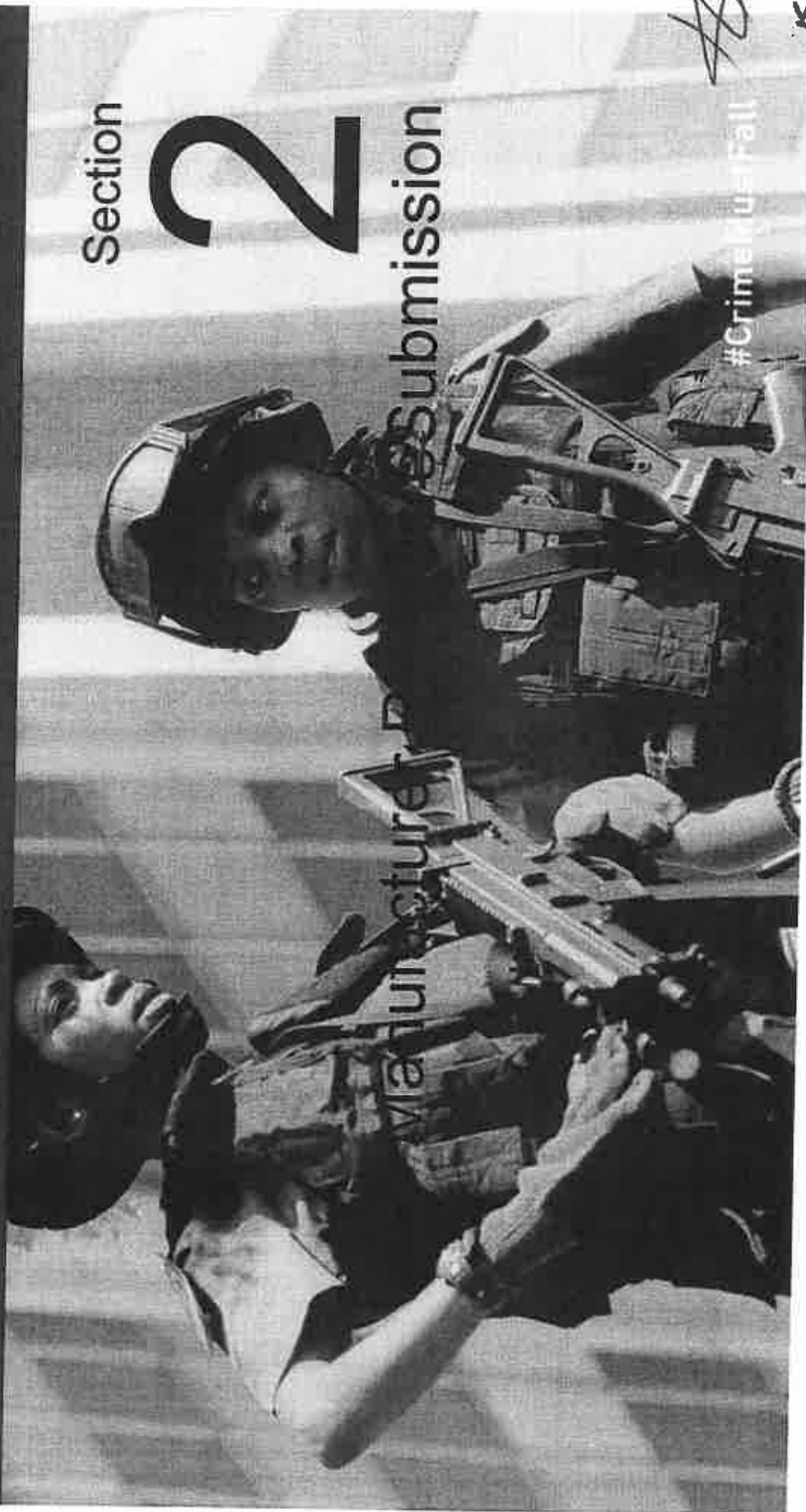
- Ability to capture data, by completing and submitting eSubmissions, including the ability to mass upload data into the appropriate submission form from an Excel spreadsheet or to submit Zero submissions, to be processed
- Capability for the responsible persons to certify/digitally sign the eSubmission forms and send the eSubmissions as a secured PDF via email in the 1st Phase (it is envisaged that a secure portal will be used in the 2nd Phase to submit the stock returns electronically)
- Ability to receive completed forms electronically (eSubmissions) from Commercial Agents (manufacturers or dealers), extracting the relevant data from the forms, validate and update the database with the extracted data
- Ability to store all submitted eSubmissions (Stock Returns) and the associated Acknowledgement of Receipt for Submission of Return in a secure repository / document content store for future reference
- A system generated Acknowledgement of Receipt for Submission of Return Progress Report will be emailed to the responsible person registered for the applicable Commercial Agent providing also the list of rejections if any exist
- Ability to re-submit the rejected returns that were listed in the relevant Acknowledgement of Receipt for Submission of Returns Progress Report
- Enquiry capability to view the submissions and Progress Reports stored in the content store and the ability to email the Progress Reports to the relevant responsible persons upon request

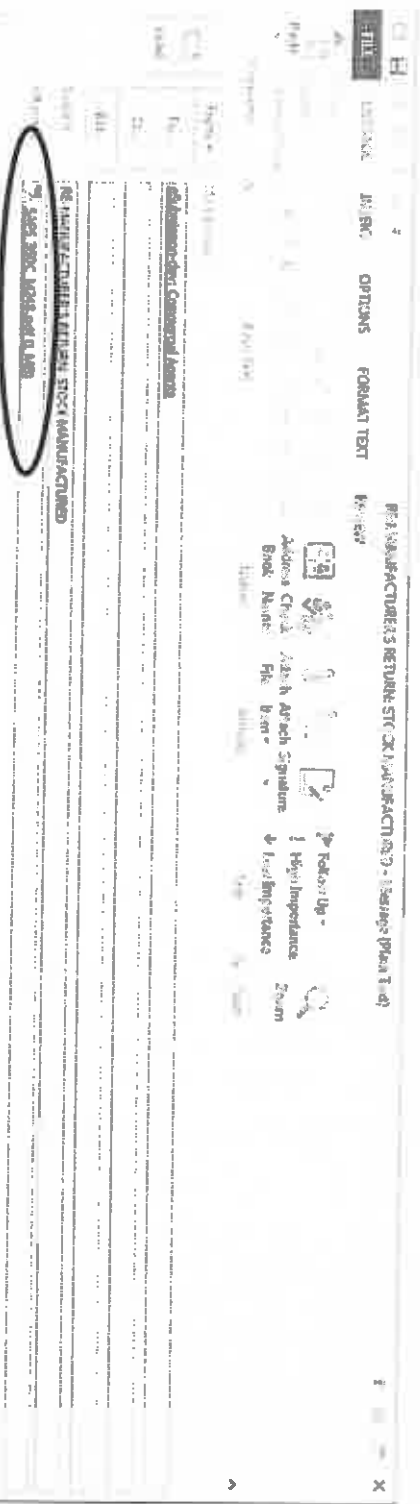

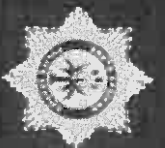

1. The Enhanced Firearm Register System (EFRS) eSubmission Solution to support the electronic submission of stock returns (SAPS 350 forms) to Central Firearm Registry (CFR) by Firearm Dealers, Manufacturers and Gunsmiths refers.
2. The development of the Firearms eSubmission Solution Phase 1 is finalised and it is at the stage of User Acceptance Testing (UAT).
3. The Firearms eSubmission Solution Phase 1 makes use of intelligent electronic forms that require an Adobe Lifecycle Licence.
4. Currently the Adobe Lifecycle Licence that the South African Police Service (SAPS) had directly with Adobe Systems Software Ireland limited, has elapsed and Division: Technology Management Services (TMS) has initiated a process by engaging SITA to address the Adobe needs, due to National Treasury SCM Circular No 3 of 2017/2018.
5. Division Visible Policing, in particular the CFR, is hereby notified of the current status that the Firearms eSubmission Solution Phase 1 can only be implemented once the Adobe Lifecycle licence is in place.
6. The continuation of the Firearms eSubmission Solution will be communicated as soon as the challenges are resolved to proceed with the UAT.

1.

1.1. I am an adult male holding the rank of Brigadier and employed by the First Applicant as the Head of the Firearms Registry, with my address for purpose of these proceedings as care of the State Attorney in Pretoria at No. 316 Thabo Sehume Street, Ground Floor, SALU Building, Pretoria. I am the Third Applicant in these proceedings.

1.2. Unless I state otherwise or the context of what I say indicates the contrary, I confirm that the facts deposed to herein fall within my personal knowledge and are to the best of my belief both true and correct.

1.3. To the extent that I refer to matters or events wherein I had no direct involvement or participation, I do so by reference to the Applicants' records, to which I have unrestricted access and verified by the officials within the service.

1.4. To the extent that I make legal submissions, I do so on the advise of the Applicants' legal representatives, which I received during the preparation of this affidavit.

1.5. I am the Third Applicant and thus I have the necessary authority and *locus standi* to launch this application on my own behalf and on behalf of the First, Second and Fourth Applicants.

THE PARTIES

2.

The parties in these proceedings, are as cited in the main application dated 27 October 2017 and in order to avoid burdening the record with repetitions, I beg leave that the relevant citation would be incorporated herein *mutatis mutandis* with appropriate changes.

THE NATURE AND SCOPE OF THE RELIEF SOUGHT

3.

3.1. In this application the Applicants seek firstly, an order condoning the late filing of the rescission application and the extension of the time periods accordingly. The reasons for the late filing of this application are fully set out hereinbelow.

3.2. Secondly, the Applicant seeks an order staying the implementation of the court orders granted by this Honourable Court on 21 February 2018 by his Lordship Mr Justice Kekana AJ, directing the Applicants to issue the Respondent with import and export permits, within twenty one days and committing the Applicants to imprisonment for thirty days. Copies of the Court orders are annexed hereto Annexure "SAPS1a and1b".

5.10. I pause to draw the court's attention to the provisions section 18 of the New Zealand Arms Act 1983 No. 44, which provides that;

"A person must not, otherwise than pursuant to a permit issued to the person, by a member of the police, bring or cause to be brought or sent into New-Zealand – ;

(a) A firearm, pistol, military style semi-automatic firearm, starting pistol, restricted air gun or restricted weapon"

5.11. I submit that on proper construction of these provisions, it is clear that an import permit into New Zealand is a requirement before firearms can be imported.

5.12. Upon the request of the import permit from New Zealand, it transpired that same had expired. This resulted in the Respondent informing the Applicants to stay the issuance of the permit, pending the Respondent obtaining or renewing its import permits into New Zealand. To date, that has not happened. On the contrary, the Applicant's addressed correspondence to our office indicating that their client is in the process of obtaining an import permit into New Zealand. In this regard, I refer the Honourable Court to copies of the correspondence exchanged between the parties annexed hereto marked "SAPS 3"

5.13. On 13 October 2017, the Applicant brought another application, this time for contempt of court for failure to comply with the court order issued by her Ladyship Madam Justice Maluleke AJ on 4 September 2017 wherein

she directed the Applicants to comply with Justice Mabuse's order dated 20 October 2015, within 10 days of service of the order.

5.14. The application was served on the Applicants on 06 December 2017. Due to the period being a festive season and misfiling of the application, the application was not opposed by the Applicants. Eventually the Applicants were granted an order by his Lordship Mr Justice Kekana AJ on 21 February 2018, on the unopposed basis. What is puzzling, is that on even date, it appears that Justice Kekana issued two orders, the first order being the *mandamus* order and the order being the contempt orders. I am advised that under the circumstances, the orders ought not to have been granted, for the following reasons;

5.14.1. In a contempt, the party sought to be committed to imprisonment, must be cited in his or her personal capacity. In this case, the Applicants against whom, the order was granted were cited in their official capacity and not in their personal capacity; and

5.14.2. The Applicant must demonstrate that the order was served personally on the Respondents. In this case, the orders were not served on the Applicants personally.

5.15. Of importance is that the order committing the Applicants to imprisonment, was not preceded by an order declaring the Applicants to be in contempt. It merely commits the Applicants to imprisonment, without affording them an opportunity to show cause (if any), why they should not be committed to imprisonment.

5.16. I am advised that an application for committal to imprisonment must be preceded by an order declaring the Respondent therein, in contempt.

5.17. Of further importance is that in the application the Respondent fails to mention to this Honourable Court that the order by Madam Justice Maluleke AJ has been superseded by events, i.e. the expiry of the import permit into New Zealand. I submit that, had this fact been brought to the court's attention, the court would not have granted such an order.

5.18. The copy of the order by Justice Kekana AJ, was only brought to the attention of the Applicants on or about 04 April 2018. In this regard, I invite the Honourable Court to a filing sheet evincing service of the court order, annexed hereto marked Annexure "SAPS4".

5.19. Against the backdrop of the background facts as outlined above, I now turn to deal with the basis on which the Applicants contend the court order falls to be rescinded and set aside.

THE BASIS OF THE RESCISSION

6.

6.1. I am advised that in an application for rescission of default judgment, the Applicants are enjoined to:

6.1.1. Firstly set out for the court the reasons and/or circumstances which for the absence in court or default calling on;

6.1.2. Thereafter demonstrates to the court, that there are prospects of success in the rescission application. In other words that they have a *bona fide* defence to the main claim.

6.2. I deal with issues of these requirements hereinbelow.

Reasons for non-appearance in Court

7.

7.1. The application was served on offices of the First Applicant on the 6th of December 2017. However, on that date the application was received by the Applicants on the 1st of December 2017. Upon receipt thereof, it was forwarded to the litigation department for further handling.

7.2. Before embarking on the opposition, the litigation department embarked on an investigation with the relevant directorate involved for firearms register. However, due to the fact that it was the Festive Season, not everyone was available to provide the information.

7.3. The officials only returned back from leave during the week of the 20th of January 2018.

7.4. Upon return thereof, legal services again embarked on consultation with the unit in order to establish the status of the application. The investigation revealed that the import permit into New Zealand had expired.

Applicant could issue the Respondent with an export permit, the registry must be satisfied that the firearm will be allowed into the receiving country.

8.3. In the absence of an import permit into such country, the issuing of such licence would, with respect, be unlawful.

8.4. In the premises, I respectfully submit that the Applicants, are enable to comply with the order on the basis that the issuing thereof will be contrary to the laws governing the granting of export permits.

8.5. I am further advised that in order to be held in contempt, the non-compliance with the order must be intentional and *mala fides*. I submit with respect that for the reasons outlined above, the non-compliance with the Court order of the 4th September 2017, was not intentional or *mala fides*. Accordingly I submit that the Applicants are not in contempt. Further legal submissions will be made at the hearing of this matter.

8.6. For these reasons, I submit that the Applicants have a *bona fide* defence to the mandamus application brought by the Respondent.

8.7. Further legal submissions in this regard will be made at the hearing of this matter.

AD CONDONATION

8.8. I am advised, that an application for rescission of default judgment ought to be brought within 20 days from the date of granting of the order. This application, is filed outside the time periods.

8.14. Further to the foregoing, I respectfully submit that the Respondent will not be prejudiced, should the late filing of this application be condoned. On the other side, the Applicants, will be severely prejudiced in that already it is clear from annexure "SAPS1" above, that there is an order committing them to imprisonment, in circumstances where the non-compliance with the order was not intentional and/or *mala fide*.

8.15. For the reasons outlined above, I submit that the Applicants have tendered a reasonable explanation for the late filing of this application. Further legal submissions in this regard will be made at the hearing of this matter.

AD PROSPECTS OF SUCCESS AND/OR BONA FIDE DEFENCE:

9.

9.1. For the reasons outlined above, I submit that the Applicants have a *bona fide* defence and the prospects of success in the rescission application are overwhelming.

9.2. In order to avoid the record with repetitions, I beg leave that the relevant portions, dealing with the basis of the rescission above, be incorporated herein *mutatis mutandis*.

9.3. In the premises, I submit that may it please this Honourable Court to condone the late filing of the rescission application. Further legal submissions in this regard will be made at the hearing of this matter.

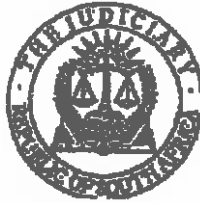

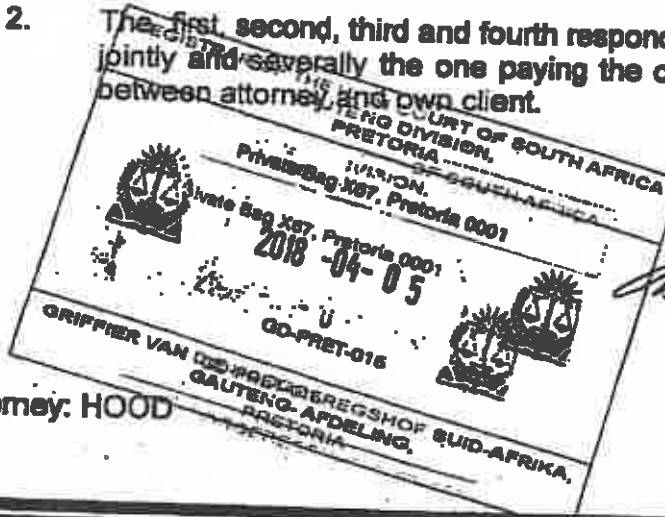

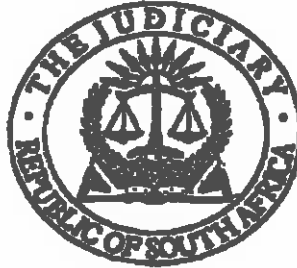

1. In this matter the Applicant seeks an order to compel the Respondents to comply with an earlier order of this court.
2. The facts as set out briefly as follows:
 - 2.1 The Applicant was granted an order on 20 October 2015 in terms of which the Respondents were ordered:-
 - 2.1.1 forthwith to uplift all and any instructions not to process import or export permit applications and firearm licence applications emanating from the applicant;
 - 2.1.2 jointly and severally to process all applications for import and export permits within five (5) days within the date of issue of an order to this effect by the above court, if lodged the first Respondent twenty one (21) days or lodged prior to the hearing of the Application;
 - 2.1.3 to process applications for import and export permits within twenty one (21) days as contemplated by Regulation 62 of Act 80 of 2000; and
 - 2.1.4 to process license applications and submit it to purchasers of firearms from the Applicant and not proper applications emanating from the Applicant. A copy of the said court order is attached to the founding affidavit as annexure A.
 - 2.2 The Applicant launched these proceedings seeking an order to compel the Respondents to comply with that court order by issuing an export permit to New Zealand in respect of four (4) firearms.
 - 2.3 It is the Applicant's case that the Respondents failed to comply with the order referred to above. The Applicant alleges that it submitted an application under permanent export number: TE6881999. However, there appears to be confusion emanating from the First Respondent's juxtapositioning of this permanent export number with permanent export number: TE6885047 arising

out of the respondent's reply in the main application. The Applicant clarified this confusion in its answering affidavit putting this to bed.

2.4 It is further alleged that the Applicant had agreed to withdraw an application for the four (4) firearms set out in the Notice of Motion. This is however denied by the Applicant to be the case. Sometime during 2015 the Applicant's Import permit was the subject of a police's criminal investigation. It seems to me that nothing came of that investigation and I shall therefore deal no further with it in this matter. Suffice to say that the Applicant is of the view that the alleged investigation was sinister and caused it serious delays in getting the application for the permits sought attended to.

2.5 The Applicant alleges to have sent numerous communications to the Respondents regarding this matter to which there has been no reply, or at least meaningful reply. Of relevance to this matter upon which the determination of this case turns, is the letter attached to the Applicant's Founding Affidavit as Annexure "LM4" which stated the following:

"This letter serves to confirm that the four (4) firearms mentioned below are not fully automatic as it is implicated/indicated on the import permit they are semi-automatic.

1. 9MMP Cobra #BW0013
2. 9MMP-Commando #SV8369
3. 9MMP R76, #NDSJ337
4. 9MMP BXP #RSA001707

Due to unstipulated time that it might take for our client to get another permit, if this letter does not meet your requirements or not of satisfaction. We authorise you to leave the above mentioned weapons of the permit. We will apply for them separately when we get a correct import permit."


2.6 The Applicant contends that it has done everything in its powers to move the process of getting the import permit along without recourse to litigation and that it is quite clear that the First and Second Respondents in particular have no

intention of complying with the court order, and have acted in a contemptuous and disdainful manner towards this court.

- 2.7 The Respondents opposed this application on the basis that firstly as at the date of preparing its opposing affidavit, its attorneys served a Notice in terms of Rule 35(12) of the Uniform Rules of Court which the Applicant had not complied with or offered any reply thereto. Before dealing with the Applicant's contentions, the Respondents raised a number of points *in limine*.
- 2.8 Firstly, in seeking the order compelling the Respondents to issue an export permit as applied for under permit number: PE6885047, the Applicant has not set out the date on which this application was submitted, neither has it set out the date on which the application was submitted nor to whom the application was submitted leaving both the Respondents and this court in the dark regarding whether the 21 days provided for in the court order has expired or not, so they argued. The Respondents submitted that the Applicant has therefore not set out sufficient facts justifying the order sought and argued for the application to be dismissed.
- 2.9 The second point *in limine* raised is that the permit number relied upon by the Applicant does not exist in the records of the Respondents. The court was referred to a document marked as "LM1" to the Respondent's affidavit, which according to the Respondents represented the search results indicating that the export permit does not exist. In the premises, the argument went, the Respondent seeks an order in respect of export permit number: PE6885047 which is impossible to grant and on that basis alone, the application should fail.
- 2.10 The third point *in limine* is that the Applicant seeks an order in respect of the following firearms so to be exported to New Zealand:
- 2.10.1 9MM Parabellum BXP Hand Machine Carbine, Serial Number: RSA001707;
 - 2.10.2 9MM R76 Hand Machine Carbine, Serial Number: NDSJ337;
 - 2.10.3 Commando Semi-Automatic Carbine, Serial Number: SV6369; and

2.10.4 9MM Cobra Hand Machine Carbine, Serial Number: BW0013.

2.11 These firearms were part of the firearms listed under export permit application number: TE6881999. The said firearms were identified as semi-automatic in the export permit application form and the import permit identified them as fully automatic. There was therefore a discrepancy between the export permit application and the import permit. The court was referred to annexures "LM2" and "LM3" which were copies of the export permit application form and the import permit, respectively.

2.12 On the 10th July 2015, the Applicant informed the Respondents to remove the said four (4) firearms from the export permit and that the Applicant will make a separate application once it receives the correct import permit which appears from annexure "LM4" already referred to herein above. This fact, the Respondents argued is confirmed by the Applicant on page 13 and paragraph 46 of the Founding Affidavit in the main application. Their argument goes further to say that the Applicant has to date not submitted a new export permit application in respect of the four (4) firearms. The Respondents argued that the Applicant hastily seek this court to put the proverbial cart before the horse in ordering the Respondents to issue an export permit in circumstances where the Applicant has not provided the Respondents with an export permit application with the correct information. They argued that the Applicant has failed to comply with the *sine qua non*s nor the prerequisites establishing the jurisdictional facts of considering such an application by this court and/or repository of power for approval of export permit applications. The application is accordingly ill-conceived, meritless and premature and should accordingly be dismissed.

2.13 As for the rest of the Applicant's allegations contained in its Founding Affidavit, the Respondents say that they simply muddy the waters and did not add value whatsoever to the case that the Applicant tries to make out and accordingly the entire application should be dismissed with costs.

3. The issue that I have to decide therefore is namely: whether the Respondents have complied with court order dated 20 October 2015. In order to do so I have to interpret the actual meaning of the letter attached to the Applicant's Founding Affidavit and which is referred to in this papers as "LM4".

4. It was alleged that the Respondents have not complied with the court order and that the Respondents argument that the Applicant had agreed to withdraw an application for the export of the four (4) firearms set out in the Notice of Motion is clearly misleading. It was contended for the Applicant that annexure "LM4" does not support the Respondents interpretation placed before this court. It was argued that the First Respondent did not issue an export permit for the four (4) firearms not because the Applicant had indicated that they should be removed from the export permit, but because of an internal process adopted by the First Respondent. It was argued further that the First Respondent is therefore in breach of the court order for a number of reasons including *inter alia* the fact that export permit number: PE6881999 has not been fully processed and that the First Respondents has placed an internal administrative procedure to take precedence over an order of court. The Applicant argues that no administrative procedure can overrule and order of court and accordingly submit that it is clear that it is entitled to the relief as set out in the Notice of Motion.

5. During arguments the Respondent denied this allegation and inslated that on 10 July 2015 the Applicant authorised the Respondents by virtue of "LM4" to remove the said four (4) firearms from the export permit and that the Applicant will make a separate application once it receives the correct import permit. Essentially the Respondents' argument is that it is clear from "LM4" that the Applicant authorised the removal of these four (4) firearms from application PE6881999 and undertook to submit a new application once they received the correct import permit. The Applicant vehemently denied this as its Replying Affidavit at paragraph 39 where it concludes that it did not inform the Respondents to remove the said firearms from the export permit and that it will make a separate application. That this is a deliberate misinterpretation of what "LM4" says. The Respondents' position is that it is clear from "LM4" that the

four (4) firearms are no longer part of permit application number: PE6881999 and that the Applicant wants the court to attach a different meaning to this documents which they submit cannot be done. The argument goes further to say the Applicant has attempted to circumvent fulfilling its undertaking to apply for an export permit in respect of the four (4) firearms and now seeks to rely on an internal letter written by the First Respondent which does not support the interpretation they seek to attach to the said letter. The said letter stated the following:

"The court order directed that this application should be processed within 5 days of the order which was 21 October 2015."

- 5.2 The Application at issue is an exportation type of application. The authority that deals with these applications in the South African Police Service Scrutiny Committee (SAPSSCO) that has been constituted in terms of the Firearms Control Act 60 of 2000 and an NCACC Act 41 of 2002. This committee sits once a month.
- 5.3 The committee is mandated to deal with applications below a threshold of 10 firearms and 20 000 ammunition. This application in question is a type that is above the threshold. On 2015-11-12 the SAPSSCO sat and considered the application and has referred it to the NCACC that also sits once a month. The NCACC is chaired by a Minister in cabinet and may sit during the course of November 2015.
- 5.4 However, four (4) firearms in the application were set aside as they are the subject of the investigation Pretoria Central CAS 1486/08/2015.
- 5.5 Upon consideration by the NCACC the SAPSSCA will then be in a position to finalise the application. It is clear from the letter that the four (4) firearms were never considered in the application as they were the subject of an investigation. The Respondent went further to say that this however does distract from the fact that the Applicant had authorised the Respondents to remove the four (4) firearms from the export permit and they had also undertaken to submit a new

application in respect of the four (4) firearms. They argue that this letter to which I have just referred to read with "LM4" are a clear indication that the four (4) firearms were no longer part of export application number: PE6881999 and that the Applicant has do date not submitted an application for an export permit in respect of the four (4) firearms. They argued that it is disingenuous for the Applicant to suggest that the Respondents are misleading the court in circumstances where the Applicant has authorised the Respondents to remove the four (4) firearms from the export application. The fact that there was an investigation in respect of the four (4) firearms and the fact that the Applicant had authorised the removal from application number: PE6881999 are not mutually exclusive as contended for by the Applicant in the premises "LM4" read with the Founding Affidavit in the October 2015 application clearly authorise the Respondents to remove the four (4) firearms from the export permit. The Applicant has not provided the interpretation which they say should be attached to "LM4". They submit that they cannot provide any interpretation as none exists, their argument went. The application is without merit as the Respondents have complied with the court order. The Respondents argued further that the high watermark of the Applicant's case is that Respondents' have not complied fully with the court order because the four (4) firearms were not processed and they state that for reasons already mentioned, this argument cannot hold water to the extent that as of 10 July 2015 this four (4) firearms were no longer part of application PE6881999. They state that they have complied with the court order in the following terms: In that the following application PE6888887 was approved on 3 November 2015, PE6881999 was approved on 3 November 2015, PE6942823 was approved on 3 November 2015, PE6949358 was approved on 16 November 2015, PE6948832 was approved on 3 November 2015, PE6955402 was approved on 28 October 2015 and PE6888513 was approved on 3 November 2015. They argued that it is cleared from the foregoing that they have complied with the court order.

6. I have already pointed out that this case turns on the meaning of LM4. Before I deal with that I wish to resolve the issue of the Rule 35(12) application. It is common cause that the First Respondent denied to be in possession of the docket. No explanation was offered for this. One would have expected some

explanation that says it is lost or destroyed, however none was offered. I agree that it is not feasible to enrol this application separately and am inclined to grant the costs so requested.

7. I now deal with the points *in limine* raised. In my view they do not take the Respondents' case any further. Equally I am not going to deal with many other issues presented to this Court in argument as they are in my view irrelevant. I am satisfied that the New Zealand authorities were wrong to describe the firearms as fully automatic when they are semi-automatic. The crucial point of LM4 is that the Applicant authorised the Respondents to remove firearms listed therein only if the letter or at least its contents did not meet with the Respondents or not satisfied therewith. This did not express straight forward authority to remove them from the Applicant's application. One could even say that it was an alternative due to the uncertainty in respect of the time that it would take for it to obtain another import export permit. To attach a different meaning to LM4 is daingenuous. It is correct that this letter placed the ball squarely in the court of the SAPS, namely if our letter is not acceptable for reasons that it does not meet your requirements nor to your satisfaction then leave these weapons out of the application. It is not unreasonable for the Applicant to expect that the Respondents ought to have indicated that the requirements were met or that it was satisfied so that it knows what to do. The Respondent simply never replied to LM4. I therefore reject their opposition and interpretation of that the Respondents attach to LM4. Their opposition is meritless and ill-founded. The 4 (four) firearms were accordingly never withdrawn nor removed from the Applicant's application. It is my view therefore that the relevant court order was never fully complied with.

8. In the circumstance, I make the following order that:

1. the Respondents are ordered to pay the cost of the Rule 35(12) application on a party and party scale;

2. the Respondents must comply with the court order dated 20 October 2015 within 10 (ten) days of the date of service of this court order on them;
3. the First to Fourth Respondents are to pay the costs of this application, such costs to include costs occasioned by the employment of Counsel on the scale as between attorney and client.
